**School Dress Code**

At Burns Beach Primary School we believe that our uniform is fundamental in establishing a positive school identity, supporting our students' sense of belonging and connection to our school and ensuring student safety. The wearing of our uniform sets the foundation for the standard of high expectations we have set for ourselves and how we convey these to the broader school community.

To maintain these high standards, the school will work with parents and carers to support students to dress in accordance with the dress code.

Students enrolled at Burns Beach Primary School will wear their choice of the official uniform items only, as outlined below:

## **OFFICIAL SCHOOL UNIFORM**

- Royal blue, teal and black short sleeved polo with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Black, single panel skort with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Royal blue and black checked dress with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Black microfibre shorts with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Black track pants with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Royal blue and black jacket with Burns Beach Primary School logo
- Faction shirt with Burns Beach Primary School logo (to be worn on PE lesson and carnival days)
- Black bucket hat with reversible faction colour and Burns Beach Primary School logo

## **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

### **Footwear**

- Plain black or white closed-in shoes. Please see attached document that provides examples of suitable and unsuitable footwear that can be worn. NB. If completely black or white shoes can't be obtained, they should be predominantly black or white

### **Socks**

- Plain black or white socks

### **Tights**

- Plain black tights (only to be worn under skort, shorts or dress. Not to be worn on their own).

### **Jewellery**

- Jewellery should not compromise the safety of the student or those around them. It is recommended that valuable jewellery is not worn, or brought, to school.

## **Exemptions from compliance with the dress code**

Parents and carers are encouraged to meet with the principal to consider an exemption to the school dress code. The principal will notify relevant staff if an exemption has been applied.

## **Non-compliance with the dress code**

All students will be supported by the school to comply with the dress code. This will be achieved via the following:

- spare uniforms to be borrowed
- provision of uniforms if experiencing financial (or other) hardship
- access to second hand uniforms
- discussing concerns with the student and their family, with concerns resolved where possible
