

## 2025 VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Dear Parents and Caregivers

The Burns Beach Primary School Board has endorsed our schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2025 in accordance with the School Education Regulations 2000 as part of the School Education Act 1999. This schedule is designed to provide you with information about anticipated costs that may occur throughout the coming school year and allow you time for forward planning of the likely costs.

The schedule is made up of the following areas:

### 1. VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions are voluntary and have been set at \$60.00 per child. This represents an important revenue source and supplements existing school funds in the areas listed below. While contributions are voluntary, the quality of our learning programs will be maximised when all families contribute. Payments can be made directly to the school via Compass, through the front office or via the Campion Personal Items Lists.

**Important Notes - please read carefully:**

- The charges vary from year level to year level depending on the nature and range of activities undertaken. The estimated costs indicated represent the maximum amounts that a parent/carer should anticipate being charged throughout the coming school year. Very few students, if any, participate in the full range of activities available. For example, Instrumental Music and PEAC involve very small numbers of students.
- Charges must be paid prior to the planned activity. If personal circumstances result in payment difficulties, please contact the Principal to make alternative arrangements or access available support.

### 3. P&C CONTRIBUTION

All students K-6 have received their Champion Personal Items List for their 2025 year level. Items may be purchased from Champion or any stationery supplier of your choice.

### 5. PAY IT FORWARD INITIATIVE

The Burns Beach Primary School Pay It Forward Initiative is a voluntary program aimed at fostering inclusivity and equal opportunities for all students and families within the school community. The initiative allows individuals within the school community to contribute an additional amount towards school incursions, excursions, and events, with the purpose of subsidising the participation of students and families who may face financial hardship. Contributions to the Pay It Forward initiative can be made at the time of paying your Voluntary Contributions and Charges or on an ad hoc basis during the school year via Compass.
